1. UNIX Philosophy Errors on System Call The system call returns -1. CHECK ALL RETURN VALUES OF ALL FUNCTION CALLS! The system call sets a global variable int errno. The global variable errno is defined in errno.h. All possible values of errno are given by constants starting with E: ENOMEM, EACCES, EINVAL,... An error text for errno may be printed with perror(). A string containing the error text may be created with strerror().

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Library: Static Linking (2) + applications are more robust (run *standalone*) + cases saving performance: many calls to library routines + errors in new library version limited to corresp. programs - program size bigger - changes in library require recompiling program static linking is enabled by gcc -static ...
